CARE's Health Equity and Rights team has prioritized the leadership of young people through our programming and advocacy and has conducted listening sessions with youth to understand what meaningful engagement really means to them. Where possible our projects that have involved youth have been youth lead and co-created. For example, in December 2019, CARE International Malawi organised a knowledge exchange with a group of vibrant, dynamic youth leaders from Malawi, Cote d'Ivoire and DRC. This meeting was intended to encourage cross pollination between young advocates by sharing their advocacy and accountability work, their concerns, and their vision for a truly youth led movement for sexual reproductive health and rights. Through this exchange challenges were raised related to funding constraints for youth led organizations, power dynamics hindering youth from meaningful participation in policy and leadership spaces, and the lack of acknowledgement from NGOs, policymakers, etc of the credibility, knowledge and subject-matter expertise youth hold.

In addition to the knowledge exchange where youth explicitly lead and created a process to define and share what meaningful youth engagement means, CARE developed toolkits. CARE, in partnership with Syria Relief and Development and UNFPA, finalized the AMAL toolkit for pregnant adolescents and first time mothers in Syria that supports meaningful participation and leadership of adolescents. In our SAFPAC project, CARE ensured young people were integrated into health committees. Through IAWG, CARE also supported the ASRH Emergencies Toolkit, which includes meaningful participation of youth as a key focus.
