Section 2: Overview

11. Please describe how your organization is implementing MAYE (no more than 350 words). Where have you done well, and why? Where are you struggling most, and why?

NCD Child is implementing MAYE within both its leadership structure and across its organizational strategy and programmatic activities.

As a global multi-stakeholder coalition, the organization is composed of a governing

council and a secretariat. NCD Child is committed to the statement's definition of MAYE, and is dedicated to ensuring that the organization is led by a mutually respectful partnership between youth and adults wherein power is shared, youth contributions are valued, and young people's ideas and perspectives are integrated into all aspects of the organization's work. To achieve this, NCD Child's governing council includes four permanent youth positions, and the youth who fill these roles equitably and equally participate in all of the organization's activities, from chairing committees, contributing to the design and delivery of advocacy activities, events, and the strategic plan, to being a part of executive leadership (i.e. Chair). By doing so, the organization effectively subverts the conventional power structures that impede youth leadership by ensuring that youth members are treated the same as adult governing members and given the same leadership and contribution opportunities, and have their input valued equally among all other governing council participants.

NCD Child's 2020-2022 strategy includes a pillar on Youth Leadership, which holds the organization accountable to pursuing programmatic and advocacy activities that strengthen capacities and support the professional development of youth advocates as a pathway to scale their meaningful participation in global, regional, and national NCD spheres. As a part of this strategic pillar, NCD Child maintains a large online community for youth, by youth, which focuses on extending leadership opportunities, engaging youth in ongoing real-time dialogue, and supporting international knowledge translation on NCD issues specific to youth in each country. NCD Child also consistently works with a cohort of young advocates and engages them in strategic advocacy in the global and regional sphere, including organizing youth-led advocacy side events at the WHA and UNGA. Bi-annually, NCD Child young advocates are given the opportunity to lead program development and event activities at the Global NCD Forum organized by NCD Alliance. Young people are voluntary participants in these activities, and given safe space to voice their ideas and shape advocacy priorities and recommendations that are shared, from contributing directly to drafting recommendations to be shared at the UN to writing their own advocacy tool-kit to support other young leaders engage in NCD discourse and grassroots action.

While the organization effectively upholds the definitions of MAYE, more work can be done to adequately extend information and promote transparency across our community of youth and advocates. NCD Child's governing council and secretariat is dedicated to communicating and extending knowledge to young people across our network and organization however more can be done to ensure that the organization's messaging, communications, and information is age-appropriate and accessible so that more youth can be informed and engaged in our advocacy efforts.

NCD Child's work fully reflects the definitions and principles of the statement, from being rights-based to safe for youth participants to advocate through our platforms and programmatic activities.

13. Where is your organization making the most progress? Provide an example.

NCD Child is making the most progress in (1) ensuring that all young people have a right, and ability, to participate on equal terms with other stakeholders on NCD matters which impact their lives; and (2) being respectful of young people's views, backgrounds, and identities. Between 2016 - 2018, NCD Child developed its own Youth Engagement Checklist which provided the organization baseline standards and guidance that NCD Child would be required to follow across all internal and external activities that engage youth. The document has since prevented NCD Child from engaging in any tokenistic actions and ensured that all young people are given the space, information, and respect required to support their engagement either as Governing Council members or as external youth leaders active in NCD Child's events and advocacy activities. More work is needed to ensure that young people are given remuneration and/or acknowledgement for their contributions to the organization's efforts and to ensure their personal safety when engaging in our work.

While we actively solicit feedback from youth as a part of event and/or programmatic post-mortems, we don't have formal and consistent mechanisms for soliciting feedback and/or complaints and concerns from young people (i.e. having an HR representative that is separate from the Governing Council or secretariat, having formal feedback surveys distributed annually to monitor and evaluate our youth engagement efforts).

NCD Child solicits feedback as a part of post-mortems via email to target youth participants, and regularly gathers feedback/insights from youth who are a part of our community through the online Youth Voices Community, which aims to serve as a youth-led platform that is accessible and safe for all. The feedback/insights gathered through the latter mechanism are generally informal and event/document/opportunity/issue specific.

NCD Child is governed by an elected Governing Council. The Council which serves as the organization's governing body, charged with establishing policies and strategies that support NCD Child's mission and goals and that advance the integrity, effectiveness, and sustainability of activities and initiatives of NCD Child. At least four seats on the Governing Council are reserved for youth representatives, who must be 30 years of age, or under, at time of their nomination.

The Governing Council includes an Executive Committee, which acts on behalf of the Governing Council in between meetings of the council, ensures implementation of Governing Council decisions, and provides direction on the operations of the NCD Child Secretariat. The Executive Committee includes the elected position of Youth Representative.
